



Conference Funding Agreement

Because the University Seminars are collegial entities, we assume that when a conference is proposed to the Seminars office by a seminar chair, the members of the seminar have agreed on the need for a conference and are committed to the organization of and participation in the conference. To qualify for as a University Seminars sponsored conference or symposium, the organizers must be seminar chairs or members and the conference must emerge from the work of the seminar.

A conference or symposium will not be funded if requested without seminar membership endorsement.

A conference or symposium will not be funded if it offers and/or pays honoraria, even if the funding ostensibly comes from another source. Even with no funding, a University Seminar may not co-sponsor an event where honoraria are offered. The University Seminars will withdraw promised funding if you or another organizer knowingly or unknowingly violates this rule.
